Christian Children's Fund Introduces its Vice President for Global Programs

RICHMOND, Va. – Sept. 9, 2008 – With more than 15 years of development experience worldwide, Anne Scott has joined Christian Children's Fund as the vice president of Global Programs. She will direct all aspects of the organization's global programs throughout 31 countries, including the United States.

Most recently she worked with John Snow International as the director of the USAID-funded Hanan Maternal, Child Health and Nutrition Project in the West Bank and Gaza. Previously, she served as executive director of John Snow International's operations in Europe. She also has worked in Bangladesh, Botswana, Egypt, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Malaysia, Myanmar, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Uganda, the United States and Zimbabwe offering in-country technical support and expertise in program management, health and HIV/AIDS programming, monitoring and evaluation and organizational development.

"Joining Christian Children's Fund enables me to address the root causes of poverty," Scott said. "Children are often overlooked as key players in addressing poverty, but CCF gives them a voice in their future, and I look forward to helping them raise their voices."

Scott holds a Ph.D. in Anthropology from the University of Pennsylvania and an MBA from the University of Kent in the United Kingdom. She is a former Johns Hopkins University Health and Child Survival Fellow and an American Association for the Advancement of Science Fellow.
