Hirschbiel's primary focus is on building an early childhood initiative in Virginia so that all of Virginia's youngest citizens can arrive at kindergarten healthy and ready to succeed. In this work he is Chairman of both The Virginia Early Childhood Foundation and Smart Beginnings South Hampton Roads.

Hirschbiel currently serves as President of Eden Capital, a private investment company in Virginia Beach.

Hirschbiel holds a MBA from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, as a Dean Scholar, and a BA in Psychology at UNC as a Morehead Scholar.
